L. M. Montgomery

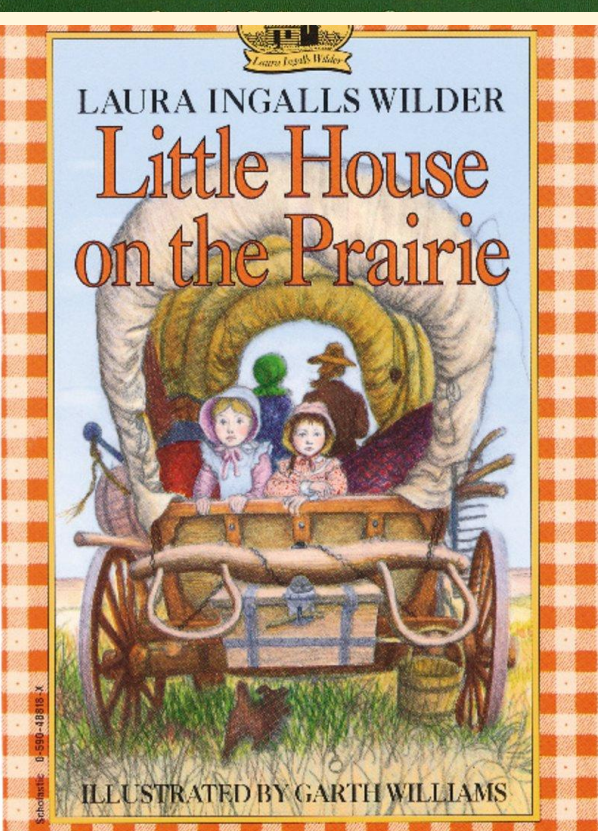

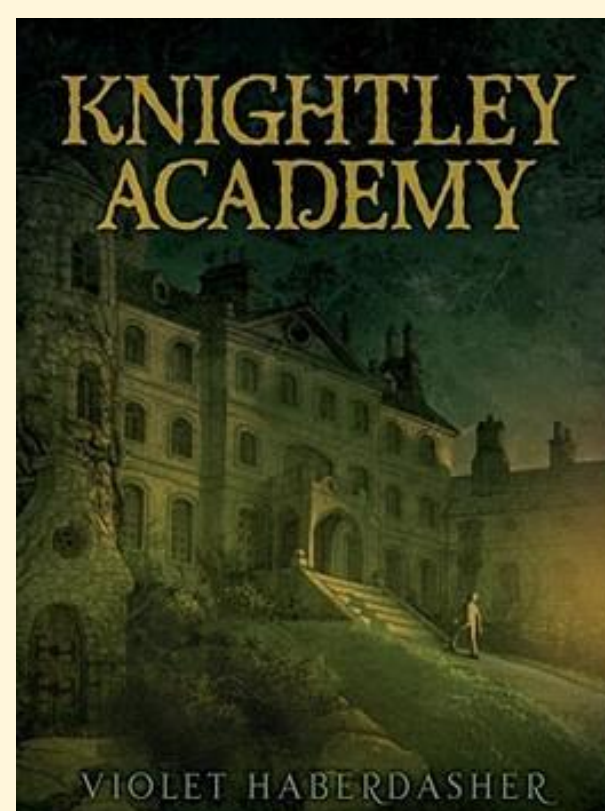
