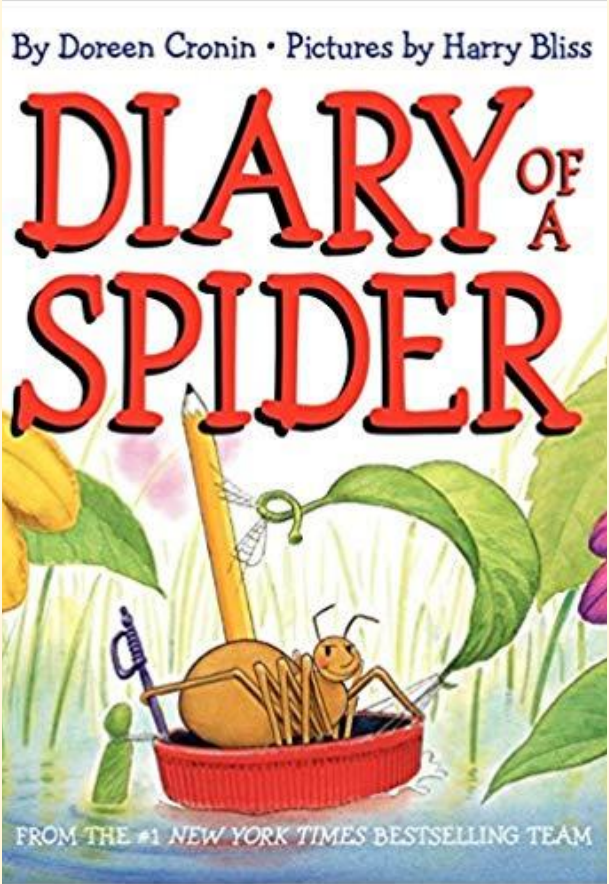


In the Tall, Tall Grass

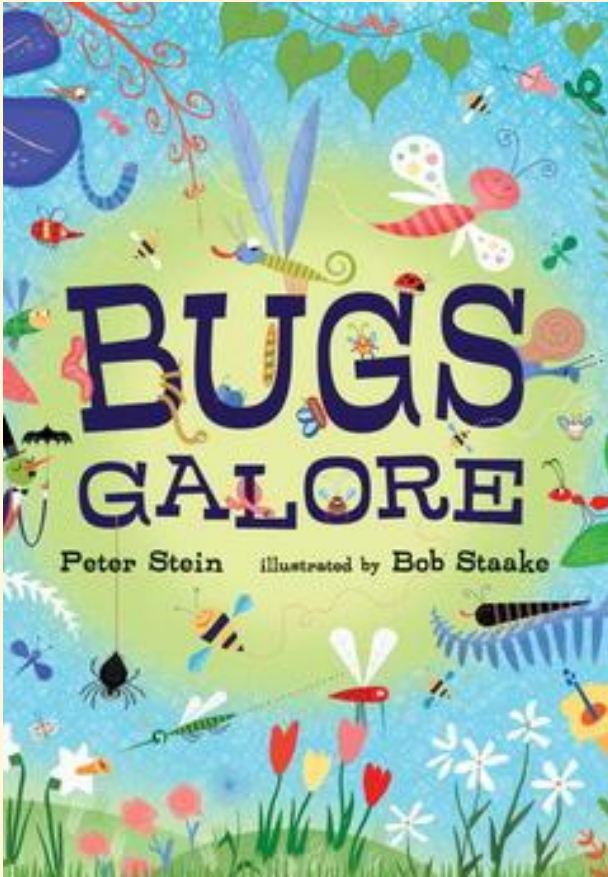

Doreen Cronin

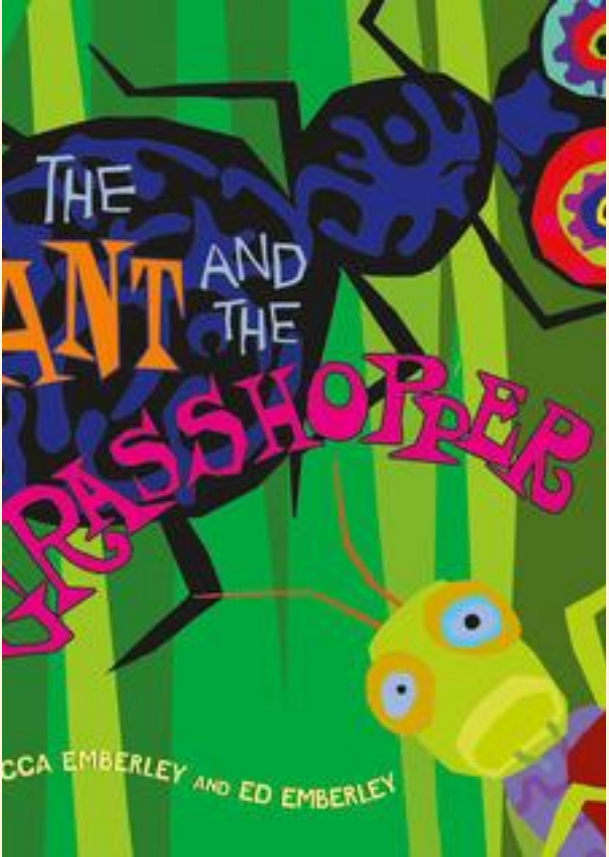
A young spider discovers, day by day, that there is a lot to learn about being a spider, including how to spin webs and avoid vacuum cleaners

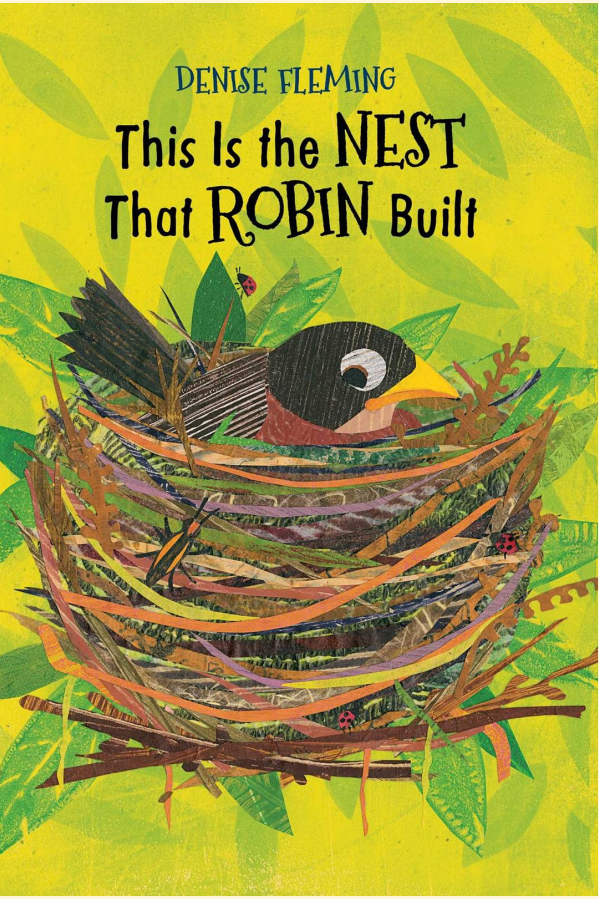
Bugs of all shapes, colors, and sizes--including bed bugs, cute bugs, live bugs, and dead bugs--are presented in illustrations and rhyme.

Rebecca Emberley and Ed Emberley

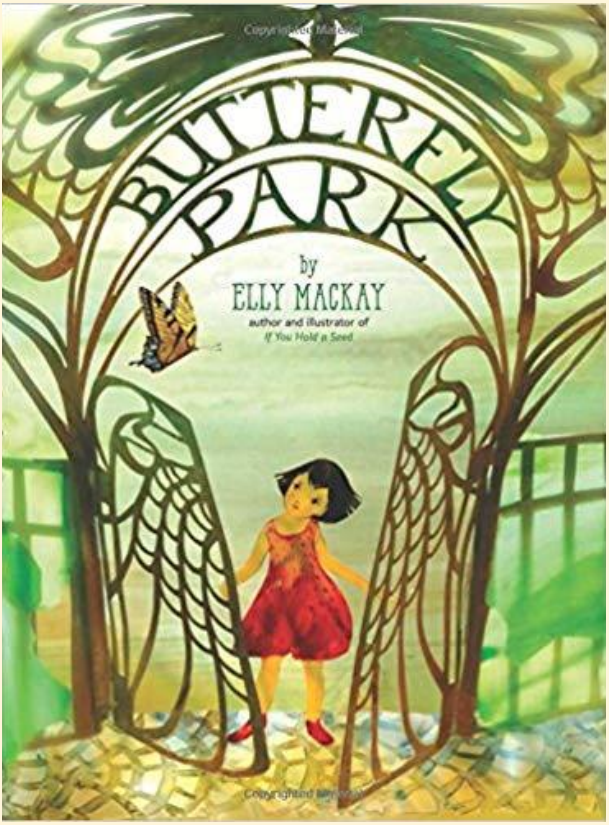
In this version of the classic fable, a weary ant is energized by the swinging sounds of a grasshopper and his "buggy" band.

Elly MacKay

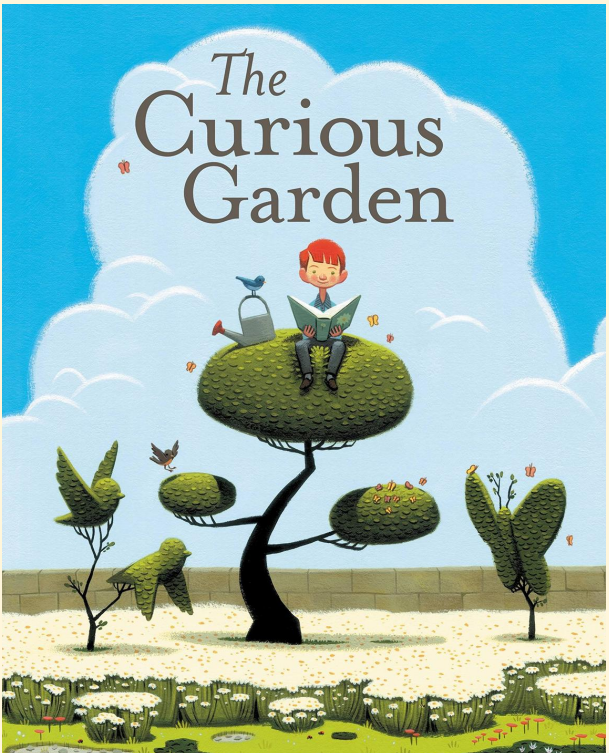
