

New Staff - REDI Librarian and Safer Spaces Technicians

You may have seen some of our new staff, REDI (Anti-Racism, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion) Librarian Jenna Johns, and Safer Spaces Technician Dwayne McNish in local media earlier this year speaking about the initiatives at TBPL to build safer and more equitable spaces for our patrons and community. Another team member also joined us in May - James Czank, a former member of the SOS team.

This team has specialized training and knowledge in working with vulnerable populations, for example: those experiencing homelessness, working through addiction or other crises, people with exceptional needs, and more. Dwayne and James bring a variety of pre-existing relationships with organizations and individuals working to support people in need. Since they are both familiar with the downtown cores, they already know many of the patrons we see each day and have helped us by sharing their knowledge. They help navigate through the needs of patrons with empathy and are often able to de-escalate conflict before it arises. Like all of our staff, these are caring individuals who go the extra mile to ensure service at the library meets the needs of the whole community.

We are partnering with Alpha Court and the Canadian Mental Health Association to provide onsite support to patrons in need.


Each week, service providers are at the Brodie Library to support patrons with things like housing applications, court diversion programming, resumé building, counseling, and more.




