


Book Review

The Girl Who Wrote in Silk by Kelli Estes

In her debut novel, the author has captured the powerful story of two women with secrets to tell though they lived centuries apart, and what they both risked to tell the truth.

The contemporary tale features Inara Erickson, who finds an elaborately stitched silk sleeve hidden in her late aunt's family estate. Fascinated by the piece, she traces it back to Mei Lien the lone survivor of a cruel Chinese purge of Seattle in 1886, who found refuge on Orcas Island. As she pieces together Mei Lien's story, Inara is forced to make a terrible choice, bring shame to her family, or betray Mei Lien by hiding the truth.

Beginning with the prologue where Mei Lien is forced to plunge from a steamship to the icy waters, the story details the tragedies she suffered as ethnic Chinese in 1880's. When her family is forced onto a steamship reportedly headed back to China, Mei Lien and her father discover that the captain



intends to dump his cargo at sea. Despite the odds, Mei Ling survives and is rescued by Joseph McElroy, who she eventually marries. They are happy together until tragedy strikes. In the present day, Inara who was struggling with debt has inherited the family home. Plunging headlong into the mystery of the sleeve, she discovers romance with the historian who helps her, only to find a truth that could shatter her world. The book explores a forgotten chapter of history and strength of character in two very different and compelling characters.

THE RECIPE

Crab Wontons (Rangoon)

Recipe taken from: Katie Chin's Everyday Chinese Cookbook, 101 Delicious

Recipes from My Mother's Kitchen by Katie Chin

PREP TIME: 15 min | COOKING TIME: 5 min | SERVES: 6-8

6 oz crabmeat (real or imitation) - flaked 2 8 oz packages cream cheese, softened 1/2 tsp salt


1/4 tsp garlic powder

20 wonton wrappers (thawed)

1 egg (slightly beaten)

Oil for frying

Sweet and Sour sauce for dipping



- 1) In medium bowl, mix crabmeat, cream cheese, salt and garlic powder till well combined.
- 2) Lay wontons one at a time on clean work surface (cover others to keep pliable). Brush edges with beaten egg, then place heaping teaspoon of mixture in center. Fold together and pinch edges to form triangle. Repeat with remaining wrappers.
- 3) In large skillet or wok, heat two to three inches of oil to 350°F Fry 8 to 10 wontons at time, turning 2 to 3 times until golden brown (about 2 minutes). Drain on sheet pan lined with paper towels. Serve with sweet & sour sauce.

THE BEVERAGE

Heavenly Days (serves 1)

2 measures Hazelnut syrup

2 measures Lemon juice

1 tsp Grenadine

Sparkling water

Lemon or starfruit as a garnish

Shake ingredients vigorously over ice until well frosted. Half fill a tumbler with cracked ice and strain the cocktail over them. Fill with sparkling water. Stir gently and dress with garnish.
