Have you ever thought about your freedom to read? It's part of your basic rights under the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms. But, intellectual freedom rights have increasingly come under challenge. Freedom to Read Week is a yearly event that encourages us to consider how our intellectual freedom is both upheld and threatened in our society.

Despite Canadian society generally valuing freedom of expression, libraries in Canada have often been the focus of censorship. Censorship in libraries is most visible as overt calls to remove books from shelves, but there are more subtle forms of censorship as well. Political pressure can influence how a library selects books, from the agitation of interest groups to more formal laws being passed to restrict collections.

Easy and open access to information is also part of Intellectual Freedom. The rise of social media is mostly a blessing, but it does create issues around disinformation. Libraries support the open nature of digital information, but also recognize that freedom to read includes supporting media literacy in readers. Being able to critically evaluate what is being read allows a reader to make informed choices in their reading materials.
