Guidelines for YOUth Knitters

Session start and end date: July 2023 - June 2024

What do you do?

Volunteers knit or crochet hats or scarves for those in need. Donations will be sent to several organizations in Thunder Bay.

How long is a volunteer session?

Each volunteer session is a year long. Volunteers must alert the program coordinator if they'd like to volunteer again in the next session.

How many volunteer hours can you earn?

- 3 hours knitting/crocheting a hat
- 4 hours knitting/crocheting a scarf

Expectations of the volunteer

- Volunteers will knit or crochet 1 item minimum during their volunteer session.
- Items must be completed to be accepted.
- Items can be of any style or design but must be appropriately sized for an adult to wear.

Expectations of the program coordinator

- The library will provide all knitting supplies (but you can use your own if you prefer)
 including knitting needles and yarn. Knitting needles must be returned at the end of the
 session.
- The coordinator will check in with you periodically to keep track of your progress and as an opportunity to ask questions or get help.

How do I submit a completed project?

Completed items should be submitted to the program coordinator for distribution. Simply put any completed items in the exterior book return slots or return them at any branch circulation desk. Make sure to either attach the name KATE to it as well as your name somehow or send the email below a message so that we can track which item is yours and give you proper credit.
